

Staff have completed 3,630 inspections (business, multi-family, IFC permit, special, complaint & re-inspections) year to date.


### Inspections Completed by Quarter - Comparative to 2021




### **Fire Investigations**


Staff investigated 2 fires in August. Total dollar loss for the year is estimated at \$3.3 million.

### Fire Investigations by Quarter - Comparative to 2021






# PROPERTY TYPE OF INVESTIGATED FIRES

### **Highlighted Projects:**


- Park 5 Apartments located at 960 Harrington Ave NE is a new 7 story, 69-unit apartment building of approximately 80,000 square feet
- Brotherton Cadillac located at 209 and 215 SW 12<sup>th</sup> St has two new projects; one is a 4,500 square foot addition to the existing dealership and the other a new stand along building of 19, 516 square feet of additional showroom and sales area.


The Department has responded to 95 false alarms in July, with \$975 in fees issued to property owners/tenants for preventable alarms. (False alarm fees were waived in 2020 and 2021).

If both parties agree that a dispute or disagreement is of such nature that it cannot be settled as provided for above, then by mutual agreement of the parties such dispute or disagreement may be submitted to arbitration in accordance with the Rules of the American Arbitration Association in which event, the decision of the arbitrators shall be final and binding upon both parties.

ARTICLE 16: GOVERNING LAWS The laws of the state of New Jersey, USA excluding its conflict of laws provisions, shall govern the terms of this Agreement and all rights and obligations hereunder No conflict of laws provisions will be applicable. Provided that the dispute is not submitted to arbitration pursuant to Article 15, any disputes arising from this agreement shall venue in the Courts of New Jersey.

RTICLE 17: ASSIGNMENT Notwithstanding anything is this agreement KFT Fire Trainer reserves their right to assign the duties under this agreement to an affiliate or subsidiary.

ARTICLE 18: EXPORT CONTROL Buyer agrees to conduct its operations under this Contract and perform all its responsibilities in full compliance with export and other foreign trade controls under any applicable United States (U.S.) laws restricting sales or transfers to other countries or parties of commodities, software, technology, or technical data. Any other provision of this Contract to the contrary notwithstanding, Buyer agrees that no commodities, software, technology, or technical data of U.S. origin or with U.S. origin content will be sold, exported, reexported or transmitted except in full compliance with all applicable laws, including all relevant U.S. government requirements. In addition, Buyer shall comply with all applicable laws, including U.S. government requirements, governing the transfer of information and items to U.S. embargoed and sanctioned countries and denied and restricted parties. Any violation of this section, as determined solely by KFT Fire Trainer, shall be deemed a material breach of this Contract.

ARTICLE 19: COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS Buyer represents, warrants, certifies and covenants (collectively "Covenants") that it will comply with all laws applicable to the goods, services and/or the activities contemplated or provided under these Terms, including, but not limited to, any national, international, federal, state, provincial or local law, treaty, convention, protocol, common law, regulation, directive or ordinance and all lawful orders, including judicial orders, rules and regulations issued thereunder.

ARTICLE 20: FEDERAL ACQUISITION REGULATIONS The components, equipment and services proposed by Seller are commercial items as defined by the Federal Acquisition Regulations ("FAR") and the prices in any resulting contract and in any change proposal are based on Seller's standard commercial accounting policies and practices which do not consider any special requirements of U.S. Government cost principles and do not meet the requirements of Part 31 of the FAR or any similar procurement regulations. Seller agrees only to perform a contract for the sale of a commercial item on a fixedprice basis. In addition, Seller will not agree to submit or certify to any cost or pricing data nor will Seller agree to any requirements to establish price reasonableness under FAR Part 15 or such similar regulations. In stating its position, Seller refers to FAR Part 12 - "Acquisition of Commercial Items." All Sales under \$3,000 are made pursuant to FAR Part 13, Simplified Acquisitions.

ARTICLE 21: EARLY TERMINATION For each Service Contract terminated by Customer after the Service Commencement Date, but before the end of the then-current Service Term, or if KFT discontinues the Service as a result of a default by Customer, Customer will be assessed an early termination fee ("ETF").

The ETF for the contract terminated by Customer before the end of its then-current Service Term will be an amount equal to the equivalent of one (1) month's fee plus 50% of the fee for the contract being terminated multiplied by the number of months remaining in the Service Term, plus any previously provided promotional credits and any expenses incurred by KFT.

ARTICLE 22: PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE KFT Fire Trainer will initiate Technical Support at the buyer/owner's facility following the receipt and subsequent acceptance of a formal maintenance contract or purchase order. All equipment to be included in this agreement shall be listed on this agreement and is subject to inspection by KFT Fire Trainer, prior to commencement date. All equipment two (2) year or older will be subject to pre-contract inspection charge. The inspection charge is waived if the equipment has no defect and is operational.



### RESOLUTION NO. 2022-02

AUTHORIZING RENTON REGIONAL FIRE AUTHORITY'S (THE "FIRE AUTHORITY") ACQUISITION THROUGH NEGOTIATION OR CONDEMNATION PROPERTY LOCATED AT 15815 SE 128TH STREET, RENTON, WA (THE "PROPERTY") FROM STROHSCHEIN FAMILY, L.L.C., A WASHINGTON LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY ("SELLER")

**WHEREAS**, the Fire Authority is a regional fire authority formed and authorized under Chapter 52.26 RCW and includes both a city and a fire district as participating entities; and

**WHEREAS**, there is a need to construct a new fire station and related facilities to better serve the residents of the Fire Authority; and

**WHEREAS**, it is the Fire Authority's goal to provide critical fire and life safety services to the residents of the Fire Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Property located at 15815 SE 128th Street, Renton, Washington is in an area in which the Fire Authority can construct a new facility in order to house personnel and such facility will allow the Fire Authority to better respond to medical emergencies, fires, and provide other essential life safety services; and

WHEREAS, RCW 52.26.090(1)(g) provides, in part, that a regional fire authority shall have the power to exercise powers and perform duties as the board determines necessary to carry out the purposes, functions, and projects of the authority in accordance with Title 52 RCW if one of the fire protection jurisdictions is a fire district; and

**WHEREAS**, King County Fire Protection District No. 25 is a participating jurisdiction, and Section V.A.4 of the Renton Regional Fire Authority Plan specifically incorporates the power and authority granted to fire protection districts under Title 52; and

**WHEREAS**, RCW 52.12.021 authorizes regional fire authorities to acquire, purchase, hold, and occupy real and personal property, and to enter into and to perform any and all necessary contracts; and

**WHEREAS**, both RCW 52.12.021 and RCW 52.12.041 authorizes regional fire authorities to acquire real property by the exercise of the power of eminent domain; and

**WHEREAS**, the Fire Authority's proposed use for the Property is a public use and necessary for Fire Authority operations; and

**WHEREAS**, the Fire Authority notified Strohschein Family, LLC in writing of its intent to exercises its power of eminent domain with respect to the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Fire Authority and Strohschein Family, LLC entered into a Purchase and Sale Agreement for the Property dated May 11, 2022 under imminent threat of acquisition by eminent domain; and

**WHEREAS**, in the May 11, 2022 Agreement Strohschein Family, LLC affirmed no individuals or business are located on the Property that would be displaced by the Fire Authority's acquisition; and

WHEREAS, in the May 11, 2022 agreement Strohschein Family, LLC waived its right to adjudication of the issue of public use and necessity under RCW 8.20.070, subject to closing the transaction; and

**WHEREAS**, in the May 11, 2022 Strohschein Family, LLC waived the notice requirements set forth in RCW 8.20.005 and 8.25.290.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED**, by the Governing Board of the Renton Regional Fire Authority:

**Section I. Incorporation of Recitals.** The recitals set forth above are hereby adopted and incorporated herein as if set forth in full.

**Section II. Public Use and Necessity Declared.** The Fire Authority finds and declares that acquisition of the Property is necessary to carry out the purposes of the Fire Authority, including but not limited to providing critical fire and life safety services to the community it serves and is therefore declared to be a public use.

**Section III. Authority to Acquire.** The Board authorizes the acquisition, condemnation and taking of the Property located at 15815 SE 128th Street, Renton, Washington and legally described and depicted on Exhibit A. The Board authorizes the acquisition of the Property under imminent threat of eminent domain or by initiation of legal action to acquire through the use of eminent domain for condemnation to acquire the Property, subject to the making or paying of just compensation to the owner thereof in the manner provided by law.

**Section IV. Reservation of Rights.** Nothing in this Resolution limits the Fire Authority in its identification and acquisition of property and property rights necessary for this public use. The Board reserves the right to acquire additional or different properties as needed.

**Section V. Authority of Fire Chief.** The Fire Chief, by and through his designees, is authorized and directed to complete the acquisition of the Property pursuant to the Purchase and Sale Agreement dated May 11, 2022 under imminent threat of acquisition by eminent domain and to prosecute an action to condemn the Property should the sale fail to close.

**Section VI. Compensation.** The compensation to be paid to the owner of the Property acquired shall be paid though the proceeds of Bond sales or such other monies that the Fire Authority may have available or attain for the acquisition.

**Section VII. No Displacement of Tenants.** No persons or businesses occupy the Property.

**Section VIII. Severability.** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or work of this Resolution should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court or competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality thereof shall not affect the constitutionality of any other section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or word of this Resolution.
