1. Welcome Member

2. 2023 Leukemia & Lymphoma Society Firefighter Stairclimb

The 32nd annual Leukemia & Lymphoma Society (LLS) Firefighter Stairclimb was on Sunday, March 12th. 17 of our members participated in the fundraising portion of the event; 16 of those members climbed 69 flights of stairs donning 60 lbs of full firefighter gear and SCBA equipment. 
4. Work/Life Balance Workshops



Staff have completed 1,587 inspections (business, multi-family, IFC permit, special, complaint & re-inspections) year to date.


Inspections Completed by Quarter - Comparative to 2022




Fire Investigations





The Fire Marshal's Office adopted a work plan that prioritized fire inspections and established an ongoing schedule based on a fire risk assessment that is applied to each commercial and multi-family occupancy within Renton, fully implemented in January 2017.






AV vs. Levy Rate




No Lid Lift, No FBC increase




No Lid Lift, 3% FBC increase YOY




Permanent Multi Year Lid Lift




Projected Revenue with No Lid Lift




Projected Revenue with Lid Lift
