SUBJECT: Renton Regional Fire Authority Chief's Report

1. Promotions/Retirements

We will be conducting "Rule of Three" interviews on June 10th to determine promotions that will be effective July 1, 2024, due to retirements.

Craig Soucy has informed us that he will be retiring on June 21st after 30 years of service. BC Soucy has shown an incredible amount of dedication to Renton Fire, volunteering to be the RFA's TeleStaff liaison, leading the coordination for the firefighter bidding process each year, and offering to Emcee wherever needed at events, all while remaining professional and humble. His last shift is on June 17th, and he takes with him a wealth of knowledge. He will truly be missed.

2. 2023-24 SFD Executive Leadership Academy

Since 2009, the Center for Leadership and Strategic Thinking (CLST) has worked to provide leadership development academies for supervisors, managers, and executives in a variety of different industries, including healthcare and veteran services. Participants attend training sessions, complete web-based development assessments, and receive one-on-one coaching to receive a leadership certificate of completion from the University of Washington's Center for Leadership and Strategic Thinking. A commencement ceremony was held on May 31st to graduate this year's cohort. Please join me in congratulating Captain Luke Alvarado and Finance Manager LaQuanza Flowers on their completion of the SFD Executive Leadership Academy.

3. Washington Fire Chiefs

I was officially elected to the position of Vice President for the Washington Fire Chiefs (WFC) on May 15th. I will serve in this capacity until May 2025 and will have the opportunity to step up to the role of President at that time.




DC Seaver, DC DeSmith, DC Alexander and I attended the 2024 WFC Annual Conference the week of May 20th in the Tri-Cities area. We received valuable information about battery energy storage systems, procurement updates, and community preparedness, among many other topics. Renton RFA is leading the way with firefighter well-being and peer support efforts, and DC DeSmith was asked to lead one of the breakout sessions during the conference to highlight a chief officer's role in those initiatives and share best practices.

4. MDA Fill the Boot Drive Update

In the spirit of community service and solidarity, the Muscular Dystrophy Association's Fill the Boot drive stands as a beacon of hope and support for families affected by muscular dystrophy and related neuromuscular diseases. This venerable campaign invites firefighters across the nation to take to the streets, boots in hand, to collect donations from the public.

The funds raised help advance research, promote health and wellness provide programs, and comprehensive support services for those living challenging with these conditions. This year, Renton firefighters raised \$3,350 in support of this initiative.

5. Recruit Class #18 Graduation

The Firefighter Training Academy Recruit Class 18 Graduation on Monday, July 1, 2024, at 1800. The graduation ceremony will be live streamed on the South King County Fire Training Consortium Facebook page.

6. Hiring Update

We conducted Chief's interviews for 55 candidates the week of May 13-16. I have made 10 conditional offers of employment, and all have been accepted. These employees will start on August 12th with Renton RFA with an academy start date of August 26th. This round of hiring will allow us to start staffing for A311 on a 24-hour basis.

7. Strategic Planning Process

We had an on-site team the week of May 28-31 to draft a new strategic plan. On the first day, 11 members of the community who responded to our call for participants, were part of the process and their feedback was incorporated into our plan. A total of 21 RRFA members were involved in the process, where our vision, mission, and values were part of the review process. In addition, we developed 5 goals with objectives that will be used to guide the RRFA over the next 5 years. This plan is a living document, so it will be reevaluated each year to make sure we are still going in the right direction and will also tie into our annual compliance reports (ACRs) as part of our ongoing accreditation process.



Inspections


Staff have completed 2,060 inspections (business, multi-family, IFC permit, special, complaint & re-inspections) year to date.


Inspections Completed by Quarter - Comparative to 2023




Fire Investigations

Staff investigated 1 fire in May. Total dollar loss for the year is estimated at \$1.4 million, and an estimated \$75 million in saved property.







Plans Review, Construction Inspections & Permits

Staff have completed 385 plans reviews, 180 construction inspections, and issued 138 fire systems and/or fire construction permits year to date.

Public Education / Community Outreach Highlights

The Department participated in 8 educational events, reaching 130 attendees and an additional 25 community events, reaching 2,332 attendees in May.



- E312 attended the Kids Workshop at Home Depot where they discussed home fire safety with over 200 attendees.
- E317 attended the Renton Neighborhood Picnic at Earlington Park and interacted with over 250 community members
- E316 participated in the fire drill at Briarwood Elementary School with over 600 students participating.
- Fire Marshal's Office staff staffed a booth at the Cinco De Mayo Community Event and provided fire safety information to over 50 attendees.
- Our public educator attended St. Anthony's School Read-A-Thon, reading a fire safety book to 50 attendees.






