#### **7. CPSE Conference**

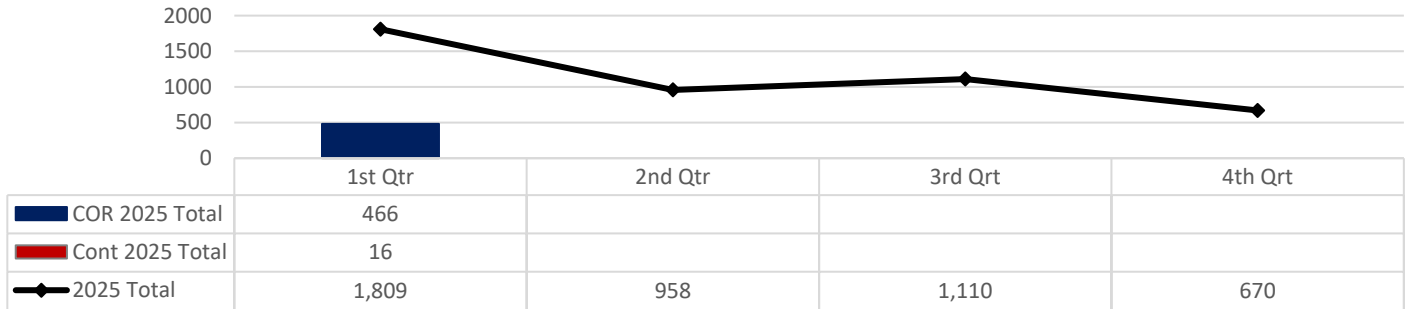

## Fire Safe Business of the Month

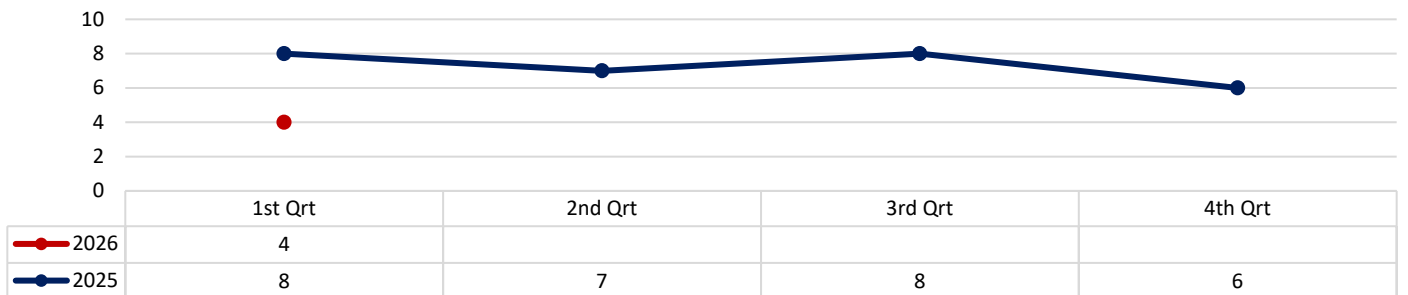

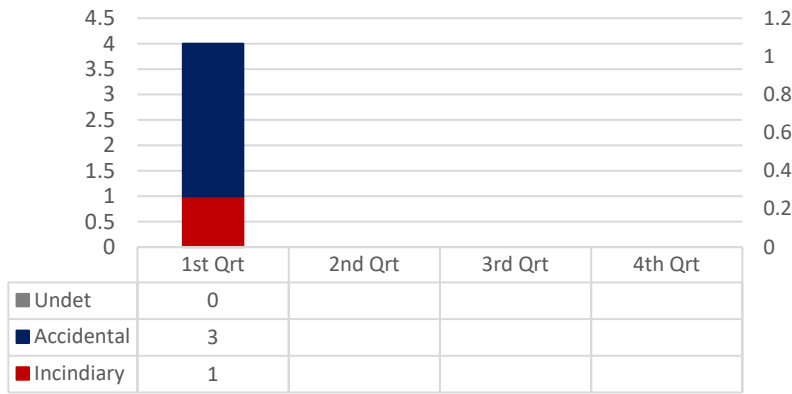
## Fire Investigations

Staff investigated 1 fire in February. Total dollar loss for the year is estimated at \$850k and an estimated \$100m in saved property.

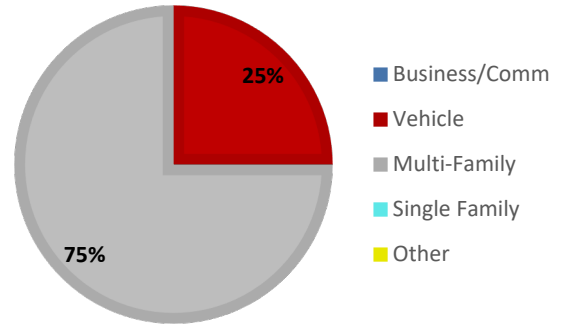
Fire Investigations by Quarter - Comparative to 2025



### FIRE CAUSE DETERMINATION



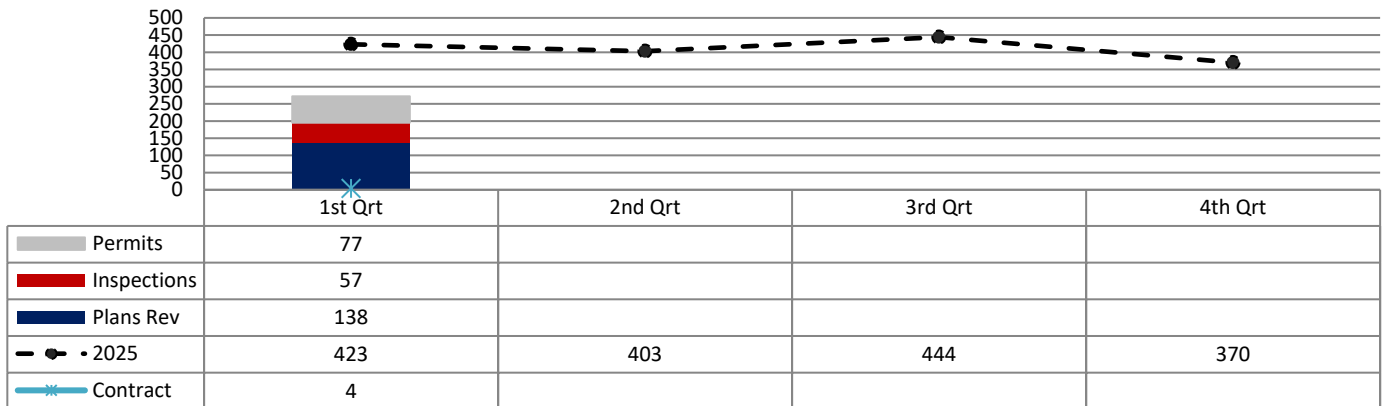
### PROPERTY TYPE OF INVESTIGATED FIRES

#### Plans Review, Construction Inspections & Permits by Quarter - Comparative to 2024

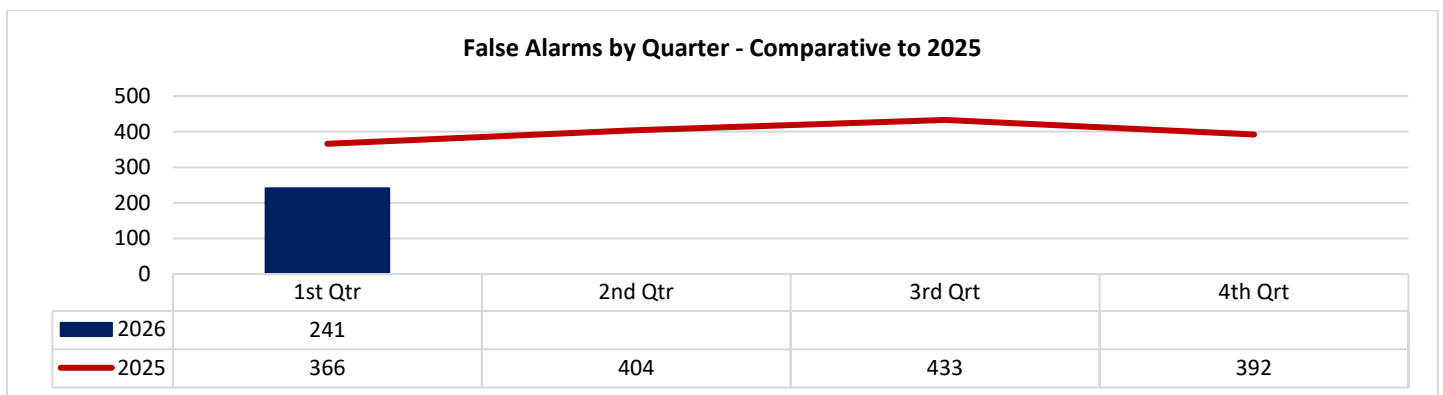

#### False Alarms by Quarter - Comparative to 2025

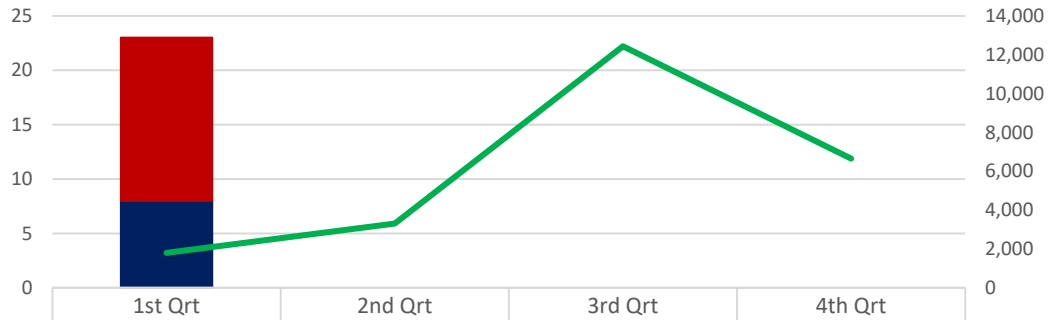


## Public Education / Community Outreach Highlights

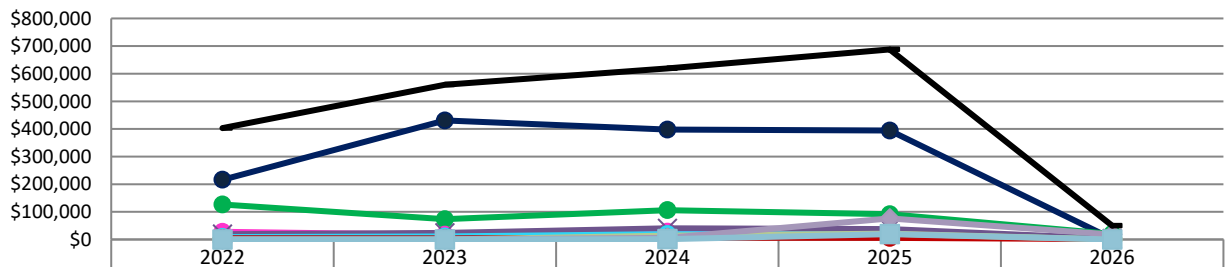

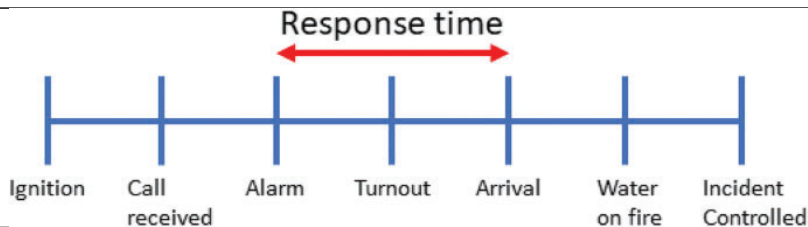
